Heart of the Revival



Dear Friends,

Abandoned.

That was the first word that came to mind as I witnessed the scene on a dark night: three girls—no older than 12—with a baby in a stroller, standing near a chain link fence. One was dressed provocatively, and another was taking pictures of her as she posed in front of the fence.

Who were they? Where were their parents? What would they do with those pictures? And, what about the baby!?

I wish vignettes like this were uncommon in neighborhoods like the one my religious community serves in, but that is just not the case. When I was younger, I misunderstood Jesus' call to serve the poor. Now I know that, while it is critical to help provide basic needs like food and clothing, the greatest poverty is the diminishment of the image of God in the human person. That is the poverty Jesus wants us to respond to!

While this kind of memory could lead me to despair, it is because of Jesus—particularly his Real Presence in the Eucharist—that I have hope. When I saw those girls so many years ago, my heart was struck deeply as I recognized how they'd been in many ways abandoned, left to their own devices without someone to protect and accompany them, not only along the troubled city streets but also through life.

Yet, because of the many hours I'd spent at Mass and before the Blessed Sacrament, I also saw beyond the distressing externals and wondered at the beauty and goodness inherent in them. Even in that dark night, I saw the light of God in them. And, I loved them.

Bringing Christ into the world begins in my own heart, with a transformation of how I see all of God's creation—especially the crown of his creation, the human person. I have discovered that the most powerful way for my heart to be transformed is through my daily encounters with Jesus in the Eucharist. What a tremendous gift this is!

As we continue our Lenten Journey, may we allow our hearts to be touched in new places by Jesus, especially as we encounter him in the Eucharist, so that, like him, we can truly see the goodness of our Heavenly Father's beloved children.

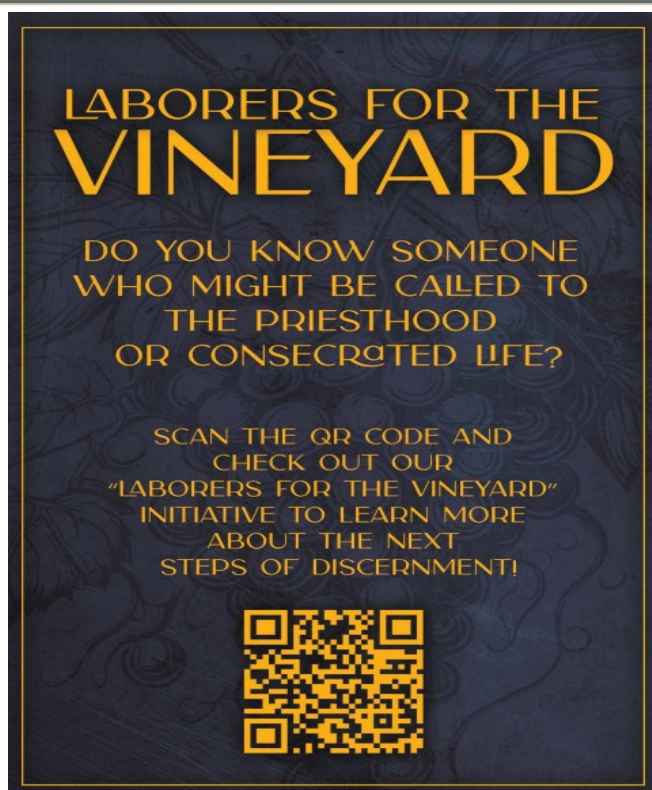
